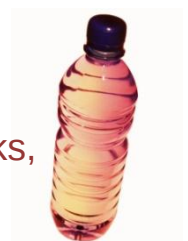

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Whyalla Golf Club is a friendly, welcoming, social and sporting club. Members and visitors are required to act in accordance with the rules and etiquette of golf, and the principles of courtesy, consideration, care and common sense. This code of conduct is designed to maintain the friendly, encouraging and welcoming atmosphere.

General Golf Play

“The game of golf should be played in the correct spirit.”

1. Show consideration to other players.
2. Play at a good pace and be ready to invite faster moving groups to play through.
3. Take care of the course by smoothing bunkers, replacing divots and repairing ball marks on greens.
4. Demonstrate courtesy and sportsmanship at all times.
5. Play according to the rules of golf and golf etiquette.

Social and Personal Conduct

“Members and visitors will conduct themselves in a proper manner at all times.”

This applies generally, and also includes:

1. Dress Code
2. Standard of behaviour on the course and in the Clubhouse
3. Standard of behaviour in carts
4. Consumption of alcohol

Reporting of Breaches

Infringements observed during rounds of golf should be reported, as soon as possible, to the day Match Committee.

Reporting of breaches of the Code of Conduct must be in writing addressed to the Secretary of WGC Management Sub-Committee.

The Secretary must refer the report to the attention of the WGC Management Sub-Committee, as soon as practicable, for consideration.

Examples of Breaches of the Code of Conduct

- Throwing of clubs.
- Inappropriate language.
- Threatening or abusing any person or persons.
- Speaking to club employees in a negative manner.
- Continually not repairing plug marks on greens and divots on fairways.
- Sexual harassment of males or females.
- Breaking the club license, for example, bringing alcohol onto the premises.
- Failing to co-operate with an enquiry.
- Not acting in accord with the WGC Code of Conduct when attending any golf function or golf event away from the club.
- Ongoing occurrences of intoxication.
- Not recording actual scores in “the spirit of the game”.
- Knowingly marking or allowing incorrect scoring.
- Not co-operating with an enquiry, or/and providing false information, into breaches of the code of conduct.

GENERAL CLUB RULES

DRESS REGULATIONS

THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES APPLY:

SHIRTS: Must have no offensive slogans or motifs. Approved golf apparel accepted.

Singlets are not permitted.

SHORTS: **Football, sport and surf/beach type shorts are not permitted**

SHOES: On the golf course:

Golf shoes or other suitably appropriate shoes must be worn.

In the Clubhouse:

Neat and tidy footwear including "dress" thongs and sandals may be worn without socks.

NO hats to be worn in the bar/clubroom area.

Members are requested not to wear soiled or dirty footwear in the Clubrooms.

SLACKS: Must be suitably tailored.

Tracksuit pants are not permitted

SOCKS: **Football type socks are not allowed with shorts**

LADIES: Ladies may wear slacks, Bermuda type shorts, or approved golf apparel on the course and in the clubroom.

Singlet type tops, tights (unless under skirts) and jeans (unless dress jeans) are not permitted

At all times common sense must apply to the dress regulations

Clean, neat casual attire is essential!

GENERAL CLUB RULES

Car Parking

In consideration of others, members are requested to strictly observe the parking etiquette. Cars should be carefully parked in such a manner as to enable the greatest number of cars to be accommodated and allow space for easy exit by all. Please refrain from parking in front of the Clubrooms and the reserved parking areas for Committee and Staff.

Bar Requirements

Members are reminded that our liquor licence does not permit persons under 18 years of age to be served alcoholic beverages from the bar area or Golf Shop. Under the licence, bottles may be taken from the premises.

Handicaps

Initially to gain a handicap a player must be a member and shall submit three (3) individual 18 hole score cards (or six 9 hole cards) marked by and signed by a club member. Any card submitted by a player must include name, date and signature of both the player and marker.

Handicaps are maintained by GolfSA through GolfLink. The Whyalla Golf Club integrates with GolfLink through its OneGolf system. When a player is allocated a new handicap, they will receive a GolfLink card in the mail which can be used at most clubs within Australia. The maximum official handicap for both men and women is 54.

Social Competition Handicaps

The Club Handicapper is responsible for official club handicaps only, and any player wishing to have a playing handicap for non-official competitions must contact the promoter of the relevant competition.

Practice Rounds

The designated Practice Fairway, Putting Green in front of the Clubhouse, the Chipping Green and bunker adjacent to the 10th tee, are meant for that purpose only. All practice play must be carried out in these nominated areas. Course bunkers are NOT practice areas. On the course proper, a player is not permitted to play more than two balls at any one time during any part of or complete round of golf.

Priority On The Course

On competition days included in the Programme, competitors have priority on the course. Any member or visitor not taking part in this competition can only play when or where directed by the Starter.

The course is closed for Major Events – (Please refer to Programme)

Cutting in on competition players on any tee, unless officially directed to do so by the Starter is strictly forbidden.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7.30 am to 11.30 am women members have the privilege of the course. Male members and others may play as directed by the Starter but must give right of way to competition players.

An 18 hole competition on Wednesday is open to both men and women from 7:00 am to 12:00 pm. Others may play as directed by the Starter but must give right of way to competition players.

OneGolf Computer System

The Whyalla Golf Club utilises the OneGolf web-based computer system to manage all aspects of golf competitions.

All members can log onto the system from any computer or phone by using their member number and password. The system can be accessed from the Whyalla Golf Club home page (whyallagolf.org.au) or by going directly to whyalla.sa.1golf.com.au or by using the OneGolf app.

Members can use the system to update their personal details, book into competitions, review previous competition results, and check handicap history. An additional app (Miscore) may be used in place of a score card to enter scores during play.

Members must book into a competition (selecting a suitable timeslot) using the system prior to teeing off in that competition. At least 10 minutes prior to their tee time, members should report to the club house to pay their competition fee. At this time they will be registered for the competition and their score card printed out. At the end of the round, members must return their signed score card to the club house (unless using the Miscore app). The match committee is responsible for ensuring the scores are entered into the system. For major events, progressive results are displayed on the competition screen in the lounge bar as scores are entered.

Once the competition is closed and prizes awarded, the results of the competition can be viewed from the system.

Whyalla Golf Club website

The golf club website is a valuable source of information about the club. Special items of interest or Club notices are regularly published on the Home page Notice Board. Other useful information includes:

New Members

Persons wishing to join the Whyalla Golf Club must be nominated by two Members and forward a formal application, together with the appropriate subscription fee, to the Membership Officer. In the case of persons being under the age of 18 years, the date of birth must also be shown.

Provisional Membership

Guidelines for 'trial period' for **new learner** members:

Form must be completed and name registered in book under Member Name (P)

- Available to men and women to try the game for a 2 month trial period - (dates as specified in application)
- Applicants are able to use the course and learn to play at member's rates.
- This is for bona fide new players who are introduced through a member and will include any new learners who sign up through the Golf Development coaching programme.
- It will not apply to:
 - past players who have already received benefits;
 - past members who may wish to re-join;
 - anyone who has held a club membership or official handicap in the previous 10 years.

Visitors

Must register alphabetically under Guest Surname in Visitor's book

Guidelines for use of this Member benefit:

- Guest must be signed in and accompanied on the course by a member.
- Guest rate is only available to **Whyalla Visitors** (non-resident). (Proof of Guest's usual place of residence will be required).
- Guest green fee will be discounted to \$20 (18 holes) and \$10 (9 holes). (These fees are subject to annual review).
- A Guest may only claim the discount rate a max of 3 times in any year.

Visiting full Members from other Golf Clubs, on payment of the competition fee of the day, may participate in an organised Club competition.

Visitors are ineligible to win Major Closed Event Club Trophies, unless from a reciprocal club, where green fees are waived. Green fees must still be paid at all other times on a per round basis.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

All competitions are conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf and current Whyalla Golf Club Local Rules.

Watch your notice board for alterations and additions to Local Rules. It is the player's responsibility to acquaint themselves with these rules. Any dispute claiming ignorance of these rules will not be considered. All members should at all times familiarise themselves with all notice boards within the Club.

Competitions are as set out in the Programme. The Match Committee reserve the right to vary the Programme as necessary.

Organised competitions are played in groups of four unless otherwise stated in the Programme. (Women's competition day events are generally played with three players per group). The Starter has the right to permit groups of two or three at the rear of the field. The Starter may at their direction alter the composition of any playing groups or start groups from different tees to maximise the players in the particular competition or on the course.

Juniors with senior handicaps may play in Club competitions providing no more than 2 play in each group and their cards are marked by a full member.

All complaints and suggestions should be placed before the Match Committee in writing.

GolfLink Handicapping System

The GolfLink system calculates handicaps by taking an average of a player's best 8 differentials from their last 20 rounds and then multiplying the result by 0.93. The differential is the difference between a player's gross score and the course Daily Scratch Rating (DSR).

Competition Registration and Tee-Off

All competitors must register on OneGolf to select a time on the computerised time sheet. Registered times will be strictly adhered to. Any player unable to keep a booking should remove it from the time sheet or advise the Starter on 8645 9109 to enable created vacancies to be filled. Failure to comply may incur the loss of playing privileges for the following weekend. When all starting times are allocated, the competition of that day is closed. Players must report to the Starter at least ten minutes prior to their listed hit-off time to retain the starting time and **MUST BE ON THE TEE** ready to hit off at their appointed time.

Players must have paid the competition fee to the Starter prior to tee off (or when passing the Club house for early starters).

Handicaps

Players will play off handicaps current on the day of play in each particular round. Prior to commencing play, players should check their handicap as

printed on their card or convert their GolfLink Handicap to their Daily Handicap using the conversion table posted on the notice board.

Handicap Match Play

The number of strokes awarded in this competition is the difference between the players' stroke handicaps. Where there is more than 18 strokes difference between players' handicaps, players shall receive 2 strokes per hole where applicable. When additional holes are required to determine the winner, strokes are awarded as in the original round. Match play scores are not used for handicapping.

Course Record

Scores recorded for course records will only be recognised when tee markers are set on the normal tee blocks. All strokes must be counted if competition is Stableford or Par.

Cards

Players are required to ensure their name, date, and handicap (and GolfLink number for visitors) and stroke per hole are legibly recorded on their score card. Players are responsible for checking their own stroke score on each hole. Players are to ensure that the Marker has signed the card and that the player has countersigned the card.

The Match Committee will only accept cards which have been returned in a reasonable time prior to the competition being closed off. All cards must be returned for handicap purposes.

Twilight Golf

Held during Daylight Saving – 20 weeks (weather permitting)

Friday evenings – hit off 4.30 to 5.30 pm, 9 hole Stableford competition.

Prizes awarded at presentation night on completion of the Twilight season.

Juniors

The Whyalla Golf Club has an active junior golf program aimed at fostering junior golf and new membership. Anyone interested in this program, enrolling a junior or assisting with coaching, can contact the Men's Captain - Darryl Preiss on 0437 816 307 or the Women's Captain – Phillis Branson on 0402 200 578 or the House Manager (or Golf Shop volunteer) on 8645 9109.

Care of the Course

Players are reminded that someone is playing behind you, THEREFORE please leave the greens upon holing the putt and replace flags such that their supporting fixtures are well below the level of the putting surface. Do not remove or alter the position of any fairway or tee markers.

Replace/repair divots on fairways or fill from sand buckets (which all responsible golfers carry at all times).

COMPETITION INFORMATION (cont.)

Sand applied on each hole by ALL players will soon improve the fairways. In taking practice swings, players should avoid causing damage to the course, particularly the tees by removing unnecessary divots. Repair ALL pitch marks on the greens.

Practice Area

Members may practice from defined areas only or areas allocated by the Match Committee. Lawns surrounding the Clubhouse are not practice areas. Putting is permitted only on practice putting green in front of the Clubhouse. Replace divots around the chipping green located adjacent to the 10th tee and repair pitch marks on the practice green for the benefit of all Members.

Golf Development Group

The Golf Development Group provides coaching for juniors and women. Many club members have completed the golf Community Coaching program. The coaches assist junior golfers, women and men to learn the game of golf. Some juniors participate in state and club junior events. Excellent training kits, facilities, golf sets and clubs, have been donated by members and the major sponsor of our juniors. Women's and men's coaching and playing of the Executive course (orange tees) can be arranged by contacting one of the coaches. If you would like to participate leave your name and phone number at the club and one of the coaches will contact you. Coaching is free – there is a fee for playing on the main fairways.

LOCAL RULES

Preferred Lie

A ball on the fairway of the hole being played, may be placed on the fairway within one iron **grip length**, but not nearer the hole. The ball may be cleaned when taking a preferred lie.

A ball lying on a dirt patch on the fairway being played may be dropped within one club length of the bare patch, but not nearer the hole, with no penalty. The ball may then be placed on the fairway within one iron **grip length** from where it comes to rest, but not nearer the hole.

The ball is in play when a preferred lie has been taken and cannot be placed a second time.

Immovable Obstructions

Relief can be taken without penalty from all immovable obstructions which include: course seats, watering equipment, signs, power poles, staked trees and all internal roadway and pathway (including ones covered with crushed gravel). Relief **MUST** be taken from staked trees. Stakes defining out of bounds are not obstructions. NOTE: Fairway distance markers or **MOVEABLE** obstructions

Power Lines

A ball striking overhead power lines and/or poles **MUST BE REPLAYED** without penalty. That ball then becomes the ball in play.

Out-of-Bounds

Out-of-Bounds on the right-hand side of holes: 6, 9, 10 and 11 are marked with white stakes.

Chipping from any Putting Surface

Chipping from any putting surface is **NOT permitted**. A dropping zone is designated for relief from the Clubhouse and the practice putting green in front of the Clubhouse.

Playing Groups

The maximum number of players in any group, at any time, is 4, except at the discretion of the Starter for club organised events.

GPS Rule

The use of Golf GPS's and Range Finders, that measure distance only, are permitted in any Competition round.

Stone Rule

A ball resting on a stone(s) may be lifted and the stone(s) removed, then the ball replaced on the original position. If the stone is embedded, the ball may be placed within a grip length, no closer to the hole.

Reciprocal Rights

These reciprocal Rights Agreements made between the listed golf clubs above and the Whyalla Golf Club are effective from the date signed by the Whyalla Golf Club, and are subject to the following terms and conditions and apply equally to both Clubs:

- 1 Reciprocal Club Member must be a financial member with golf privileges of the club.
- 2 A reciprocal club member will pay the same daily fee(s) as our full members, or will pay a 50% (see above) of the Visitor fee for a round of golf. This fee will apply seven days a week.
- 3 Members wishing to use the facility must:
 - Advise of this Reciprocal Rights agreement at the time of booking;
 - Present their current Membership card when visiting the Club.
- 4 Reciprocal Members are not eligible to enter/win Club Championships, Monthly Medals, Board Events or dedicated Member Events.
- 5 Both Parties can make amendments to this agreement by mutually agreeing in writing to such amendments.
- 6 Members using reciprocal arrangements must adhere to the rules, conditions and regulations of the host Club.

Club Championship

The Championship is a four-day event held on the last two weekends of May. The first weekend is a 36-hole qualifying stroke event, with match play finals held over the second weekend.

MEN'S GOLF COMPETITION INFORMATION & CONDITIONS (cont.)

Monthly Medal and Eclectic

This is a stroke competition played on the 1st Saturday of each month during the season (7 months) with both gross and nett winners in each grade. The eclectic score is calculated from these events. The eclectic is a non-graded event with both gross and nett winner.

72 Hole Championship

This is played over the 7 monthly medal rounds with the best 4 rounds used to calculate a players score. The best total gross score over the best 4 rounds is deemed the winner in each grade.

Mixed Foursomes Championship

Each team must consist of a male and a female member and is played using standard foursomes' rules. This is a non-graded event with the award going to the best gross score.

36 Hole Stableford

A stableford event played over 2 consecutive days with winners in each grade.

Foursomes – Club Championship

A non-graded event played using standard foursomes' rules with the award going to the best gross score.

Marce Brown

Qualifying is a stroke event over 18 holes. The best 8 players then play handicap match play to decide the winner.

Lynn Norman Memorial Shield

Awarded to the best nett score on the day.

Handicap Foursomes Championship

Played using standard foursomes' rules. Qualifying is over 18 holes with the best 4 team nett scores playing handicap match play to decide the winner.

Bob Armes Ambrose Shield

This is a Team Ambrose event with the shield awarded to the best nett score on the day.

Best nett aggregate over two rounds.

Match Play

Handicap event – knockout – match play, in the event of a match being squared at the 18th, the winner will be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off with the appropriate strokes being given and received. Final will be played on an arranged date.

International Bowl

Silver and Bronze divisions: (this competition is run to raise money to send Australian golfers overseas). Best one of three 18 hole stroke rounds.

Shylie Rymill

Handicap foursome's event: Winning pair – lowest nett score. Half combined handicaps used. State-wide event and the winning card from each club will be returned to Golf SA. Best nett score within our club will win a Shylie Rymill Brooch each.

GENERAL

Count-Backs

In the event of a tie in a competition (Stroke, Stableford or Par) where the count-back applies, the Order of finishing will be determined by the better score over:

- the last 9 holes, then
- the last 6 holes, then
- the last 3 holes, then
- hole by hole from the last hole.

Cards

All competition cards must be handed in as soon as possible after which no alterations may be made.

Handicaps

To obtain an initial handicap a player must be a financial member and submit three (3) 18 hole score cards or six (6) 9 hole cards or a combination totalling 54 holes. Cards must be marked and signed by a club member.

WOMEN'S GOLF COMPETITION INFO AND CONDITIONS (cont.)

Handicaps are maintained by Golf Aust through GolfLink. The Whyalla Golf Club integrates with GolfLink through its OneGolf system.

Your handicap is your own responsibility. Always check your handicap before playing.

Match Play Events

Strokes given in handicap match play events must give full difference of handicap.

All players who play in qualifying round will be eligible for Match Play. Match Play games must be played on the stipulated date.

Women Members Division Handicaps

All one division

Women's Golf - Club Handicaps

To be decided by the Match Committee

EXECUTIVE COURSE – ORANGE TEE COURSE

Whyalla Golf Club has three courses!

- The men's course – blue tees
- The women's course – red tees
- EXECUTIVE COURSE (short course) – orange tees.

While the Executive Course will be used more frequently by juniors, beginning women and older seniors – it is open to all. This course is particularly handy for time-poor golfers who still want to play 9 or 18 holes.

Costs to play are the same as for the full course. Cards for the Executive Course are available at the golf shop.

All players tee off on the fairway at right angles to the orange posts. (On the 4 existing par three holes, the women's tees will be used).

COMPETITION DESCRIPTIONS

Stroke (Nett)

The stroke scores for each hole are added together then the handicap deducted.

Stableford

Points awarded for each hole based on the net (handicapped) score

Par

Positive, half, or negative score for each hole based on net (handicap) score

Foursomes

Played in teams of 2. Each team uses one ball with players taking alternative shots, as well as odd and even tees.

4BBB

Played in teams of 2. Best score per hole taken.

Ambrose

Played in teams of 2 or 4. Players play their shot from the location of the selected ball. Players drop their ball within one club length of selected ball (and if on fairway) may place within one grip length.

Quota

Played as a gross Stableford with the following points per hole:

Bogey – 1 point

Par – 2 points

Birdie – 4 points

Eagle – 8 points

Player's handicap added to total score at the end of the round.

Bisque Par

Similar to par except players allocate their handicap to holes at their own choosing. Handicap strokes are added to the hole after completing the hole but BEFORE teeing off on the next hole.

Irish 4BBB Stableford

Played in teams of 4.

Holes 1-6: best Stableford score taken

Holes 6-12: best two Stableford scores added together

Holes 13-18: best three Stableford scores added together

Multiplier Stableford

Played in teams of 2. For each hole the two Stableford scores are multiplied together.

Split 6's

Handicap Stableford played in teams of 2.

Holes 1-6: best Stableford score taken

Holes 7-12: both Stableford scores added together

Holes 13-18: both Stableford scores multiplied together

ETIQUETTE OF GOLF

Golfers are placed on their honour “to play the game”, as it not only concerns an opponent, but in competition the whole field. They therefore honour and observe all the RULES and immediately notify their marker of any infringements or penalties they may incur.

No one should move or talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke. A player playing a provisional ball off the tee must wait until all other players have teed off.

If a player believes their ball may be lost outside a hazard or is out of bounds, to save time, they should play a provisional ball. Players searching for a ball should signal the players in the group behind them to play through as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. The allowed time to search for a lost ball is three minutes. Having allowed the group behind to play through, they should not continue play until that group has passed and is out of range.

When the result of a hole has been determined, the player should immediately leave the putting green and ensure that the flagstick is properly replaced into the hole.

Pace of Play

Players should not at any time cause undue delay. Slow play is possibly the greatest frustration on any course and may be penalised under the Rules of Golf.

“From Rule 5.6 Unreasonable Delay; Prompt Pace of Play. For the purpose of preventing slow play, the *Committee* may in the conditions of a competition (Pace of Play Policy 5G), establish pace of play guidelines including maximum periods of time allowed to complete a *stipulated round*, a hole or a *stroke*. In stroke play only, the Committee may, in such a condition, modify the penalty for a breach of this Rule as follows:

First offence – One stroke

Second offence – Two strokes

For subsequent offences – Disqualification.” Rules of Golf 2019, p 52.

To preserve harmony in the Club, and show due regard for the interests of others, members who are naturally slow players should choose to play at times when there are fewer players on the course. By so doing, they will place themselves either well in front of, or well behind the main field. While, as indicated above, calling through quicker players is required, no amount of letting other players through will compensate for perennial slow play during busy periods.

ETIQUETTE OF GOLF (cont.)

No player should play until the players in front are out of range.

All players must carry sand buckets and repair divots with sand on the fairways and repair ALL pitch marks on the greens.

Priority on the Course

Unless otherwise determined by the *Committee*, priority on the course is determined by a group's pace of play. Any group playing a whole round is entitled to pass a group playing a shorter round. The term "group" includes a single player.

Rake smooth all marks upon leaving bunkers and leave the rakes in the rake holders.

Players will conduct themselves in a proper manner at all times. Practice swings must not result in damage to teeing areas.

Players must observe the course as it is laid out and not "cut in" anywhere on the course unless directed by the Starter and if caught by competition players, be prepared to permit them to play through.

Motorised Buggy Use: Notices regulating the movement of mechanical carts are displayed within those carts and should be strictly observed. All persons who hire a motorised buggy shall agree to abide by the following rules:

1. Two people only may ride on the cart
2. Only two sets of golf clubs may be transported on the cart
3. Carts must not be driven within 5 metres of tees and greens
4. Soft ground and muddy areas must be avoided at all times, as must areas of sandy rough
5. Carts must be returned to the point of hire at completion of a round.

Social players must give way to players involved in Club Competitions listed in this programme.

Injury and Damage: Members are requested to report to the Captain immediately or on completion of their round:

- Any injury caused to any person, or
- Any apparent damage caused to any property or vehicle, whether within or outside of the Club boundary.

Note: The Official Guide to the Rules of Golf 2023 edition can be accessed from the internet or via the Golf Australia App. A hard copy is situated in the club house.

QUICK AIDS TO QUICK PLAY

- Do not practice swing when it is your turn to play.
- When it is your turn to play, do so at once.
- Walk briskly – you do not have to run.
- Study your line on the putting green while others are putting. You do not have to move about to do this, but you do have to get to the position of your ball before the first player putts.
- Leave your buggy intelligently beside the green so as to be able to pick it up on the shortest way to the next tee. DO NOT leave your buggy in front of the green.
- When your ball is lost, immediately call following players through.
- The first two players that hole out to proceed to the next hole.
- Record your scores for the hole last played while waiting to hit off the next tee. Do not do so on the green you have just played.
- In Par and Stableford competitions, pick up when a score is no longer possible. This will help to keep the game flowing and help to avoid slowing the competition down.

We encourage you to use the course at times most convenient for you. However, if these times are outside normal Golf Shop and Bar hours, **please pay your fees** with the facilities available.

SAFETY

The Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Act requires the Whyalla Golf Club Inc. to maintain a safe working environment and in adopting procedures to prevent workers from injury from balls, the following will apply at all times:

Greens Maintenance

When the flag has been removed, the green is out of play and golfers are not permitted to hit to the green until the flag is replaced.

Maintenance Vehicles and Personnel

Golfers must wait for an approaching vehicle to pass behind, or out of range, before playing their shots unless signalled by the operator to play their shots.

All players need to read the Safety sign outside the Golf Shop.

Snake Bite Notice

A First Aid notice regarding Snake Bite is posted on the Notice Board.

WARNING

DO NOT wash venom off the skin.

DO NOT cut the bitten area.

DO NOT try to suck venom out of wound.

DO NOT use a tourniquet.

DO NOT try to catch the snake

DO call 000

Do apply a pressure bandage and rest the limb

Long Dry Spells – All Day Closures

Course
